Simple Fundraising Ideas

- **Annual Collection**

Hold a high school reunion (dinner or luncheon) as this gives you the opportunity to ask for donations. Make it an interesting affair and pull in more people by inviting an interesting speaker to address the group.

- **Loose Change**

Go out to your audience and ask them to check around their house for any loose change. This loose change, no matter how little can then be donated to Catalyst Foundation and banked when you have received a good amount. Spread the word wide and far and get everyone checking the back of their sofas.

- **How many sweets in the jar**

Fill a jar with a set number of sweets. People guessing the number of sweets pay a small fee and the person closest to the correct number wins the jar of sweets.

- **Birthday Fundraising**

Online Fundraising Ideas

- **Gaming Tournament**

- **Online Pub Quiz**

Kids will love to help you do a virtual bake-off competition. Challenge friends to a baking competition and ask them to donate to enter. Share the finished creations over video chat and everyone can judge who has won. Don't forget to set a show-stopper theme!

A virtual coffee morning is a lovely way to catch up with friends and family that you have not been able to see in person for a while. And who doesn't love a bit of cake? You could play some online games or just gather round for a good natter.

- **Gift Aid**

This one is a UK specific fundraising idea. In a nutshell, Gift Aid gives a charity the right to claim back tax that is collected on their donation. It makes sure that every penny of what you raise goes to the charity and is not taken away by the government. To make sure you can do this, you'll have to sign a Gift Aid declaration. - **Shop and Give**

- **Giving Lottery**

An exciting fundraising lottery scheme to enable good causes to raise vital funds, players could win up to £25,000, businesses can launch their own lottery.

- **Video Gaming Tournament**

Gaming is absolutely huge, so there shouldn't be a shortage of people to approach to take part. You'll have to find an appropriate video game and put a competitive edge on it, decide the tournament structure and have people compete for a prize. By having contestants pay an entry fee, you'll be able to fundraise, and donate the proceeds to Catalyst Foundation.

Offbeat Fundraising Ideas

- **Bands' Battle with a Twist**

This is one of the most fun and popular ideas. Not only does it raise funds for Catalyst Foundation in an interesting way, but it also gives a chance for local artists to present their talent to the public. Wait! What's the best thing about this one? Since so many groups of people are involved, it is easy to get more sponsorship. All you need to do is make arrangements for venue and logistics. And you are good to go. The tickets, along with donations will fetch you enough funds.

Get 4 groups of 4 to compete, with everyone putting in £25 for example. The winner from each group of 4 then plays in a grand final with the winner receiving £100 and the rest going to Catalyst Foundation. Participants can create a blog and give weekly updates on the competition, including photos and any kitchen disasters or triumphs!

- **Walking to School for a Week**

All the money that is saved in this process, which would have otherwise been spent on fuel, can be donated to Catalyst Foundation.

Fundraising Ideas for 'Down the Pub'

• Karaoke Night

People of all ages love karaoke. All you must do is rent a karaoke machine, and hold a fundraising event in a local pub, or even in your backyard. Sell tickets for people to enter the contest and see how you can have hearty fun while fundraising.

• Pub Quiz

This one will have to be for people old enough to legally drink. Pub quizzes are a regular weekly event in many places, so you might be able to arrange to compare one that already gets weekly attendees. Otherwise, many establishments will be happy if you can bring in extra clientele, particularly on the quieter evenings. Make sure to get a good prize for the winning team to pull in a crowd. You can raise the funds by selling tickets and if you negotiate well, perhaps even a share of the drink sales.

• Sports Quizzes

Fun as they already are, you can try roping in another local club apart from the one that you support. This will add some spice. You could also get a pub to sponsor you, and the venue could be the pub itself.

• Happy Hour

If you have lots of friends who you are in good terms with, send out invitations for a happy hour. Make sure that the word is spread as far and wide as possible. Since the pub that you choose as the venue is going to see tremendous sales for the chosen evening, ask them for a sponsorship. If the gathering is small, it is a good idea to ask for donations. But, if it is a large one, tickets and a raffle is going to be lucrative.

Sport Fundraising Ideas

• 5-side Football Tournament

Football is ingrained into the heart of people all over the world. As a fundraising idea, coordinating a tournament will take a bit of work but the outcome can be great. It's a fun day for all involved, pulls together a large community of people, and can raise some great money for your cause. You'll have to get a trophy for the winning team and arrange for there to be space to play.

• Abseiling

For those who would like to push themselves out of their comfort zone, consider abseiling. It is certainly not as dangerous as skydiving or paragliding but will still make people weak at the knees. Abseiling is quite common as an adventure sport and is a good fundraising idea. You can get your friends to sponsor you or try to get sponsorship from an adventure sports store or company.

• Arm Wrestling Competition

Arm wrestling competitions can create a fun, and sometimes competitive atmosphere. They can work well with pub goers. Consider pitching sports teams against one another, then charge them to compete and prove their team is the best.

• **Buddy Nights**

Buddy nights are great ways to fundraise if you're part of a sports club. Teammates bring along a friend to a fun-oriented training session, who pay a small fee to take part. The double bonus is that if your buddies are impressed, you might get some additional members wanting to join your club.

• **Dancing Lessons**

Let's have a little fun and maybe help some people who have two left feet. Within your social circle and beyond, there are bound to be some people who like to put their boogie shoes on. Rope them in for instructing, sell some tickets, and let the learners mingle with the dancers. Charge a registration or a lesson free from the learners, and voila!

• **Darts Match**

All you need is a dart board, darts, and some space. You may find these at a local pub, and they might be willing to sponsor it, as its likely to help with drink sales too. Or, if you find your own place you could raise further funds by charging for drinks.

• **Extreme Fundraising**

This is one for the thrill seekers. Take a favorite leisure activity to the extreme or try something you haven't done before – all in the name of raising funds for your favorite cause. There is quite a lot of choice – although this may come down to what you can do near you. Have a look online and start fundraising!

• **Jog-athon**

Jog-athons work with sponsorships. Get each covered mile sponsored by different sponsors. That makes getting sponsorship easy. Doing this by convincing a gym, or shoe store is a unique fundraising idea.

• **Marathon Events for All**

This one has never been beaten. Marathons for football, tennis, table tennis, badminton, or any sport that interests a lot of people can work for you. Get sponsorships from sports related sponsors, hire a place, and get ready to raise some massive funds.

• **Shed Some Pounds**

You will need some grit for this. Set a timeframe for shedding some remarkable weight. You can get it sponsored by a gym, or by a dietician, to raise more funds. It is not only a motivating way to get back in shape, but also a noble gesture for Catalyst Foundation.

• **Sponsored Bungee Jumping**

If you are adventurous and interested in bungee jumping, you should think about getting sponsored to bungee jump on a special occasion for Catalyst Foundation. Since this is not something that people do every day, sponsorships will be easy to get. But make sure that you are adequately insured, and above all, safe.

• **Sport-athon**

The best fundraising idea for supporting a sports club is to organize a sponsored sport-athon. It is different than a regular match, the duration is much longer, precisely the reason why it fetches more sponsorship than usual. You can keep a match on for hours. Apart from the sponsorship, the tickets and snacks for sale will also add to your funds raised.

• **Sports Skills Workshop**

There is all probability that local sports fan would like to hone their skills in their favorite sport or given the chance, with a professional instructor. So, you can give them both, and raise some funds at the same time. You can rope in professional/amateur players, or coaches, or trainers from the club that you support, and get them to train those who are willing to be trained. You will get ample funds as registration fee as well as tuition fee, while the public will get a chance to learn from the pros. And do not forget to market your endeavor well before you start with the workshop.

• **Televised Matches**

In case there is big match that your team is playing in, it's going to work very well if you hire a place and a projector to have it televised. Charge a little fee from the audience to raise funds. Arrange for some snacks and sell them to those who want to enjoy the match more.

Fundraising Ideas with Children

• **Displaying BMX Bikes**

You might find a sizeable number of local kids with BMX bikes in the parks around you. Get them around to organize a display of their bikes, and maybe show-off some tricks. Make it a fundraising event, market it, sell tickets for people to see it, and see funds coming in for Catalyst Foundation.

• **Talent Show**

This may be an old trick, but here is the kicker: let the children host it themselves. Hopefully you will attract more audiences, accolades, and funds. Parents can bring in refreshments – and a good party is on the cards.

• **Paper Planes**

This is an easy fundraiser and great for kids. Get the children to make a paper airplane to decorate, and then charge a small fee for each child to enter the race. The airplane which goes the furthest wins a prize and the rest of the funds go to Catalyst Foundation.

• **Welly Throwing**

All you need is a field and a group of people with wellies. Charge a fee to enter and offer a prize for the winner. Why not get the prize sponsored by a local business or retailer.

• Animal Dress-up

Well, this is just a cousin of the ever so popular fancy dress. Not only do the children love it, but the adults might also find it amusing too (just don't overdo it). You could get sponsorships easily; the registration fee will also add to the funds. If it is a success once, make it an annual feature.

• Animal Show

You can't miss out on this one, particularly if you are supporting this type of cause. Organize a show that brings the public, especially children, closer to these animals, and teaches them about the challenges they face. Just make sure that the animals don't get distressed. The tickets will help you fundraise with ease.

• Dog Walking

Talk to your neighbors and see who you can help for a small donation. As well as fundraising for Catalyst Foundation, you would be helping your neighbors, and it is a great chance to foster community relations, catch up or meet new people.

• Dog Wash

Dogs are by far the most popular pets in the UK and the world over. Do it for small charge, and dog owners will rush to you. If you could get sponsored by a pet shop, you can also add dog grooming to your service.

• Pet show

Pet owners love to show off their furry companions. Even more so with the chance to win some accolades for their cherished pet. Chances are, if you try approaching a local pet shop for sponsorship, the results would be positive. Just do some brainstorming for finding unique ideas for titles – like the laziest dog, or the heftiest cat, and the show is sure to get popular as an annual fundraiser.

Fundraising Ideas in Nature

• Nature Trails

Ever discovered the nature trails in your area? Well, you could be a guide for a good reason. Charge a nominal amount from people who wish to go for treks or nature watch.

• Worm Charming

That's right! It's quirky enough to grab the attention of people. It is even part of some annual fetes. Worm charming is particularly enjoyed by teenagers and young adults. A grassy area is divided into parts, on which each participant must bring out worms and collect them. The person with the maximum number of worms wins. Charge an entry fee. You can also create funds by selling jars and instruments for the game. The prize can even be sponsored.

- **Gardening Tips**

Do you know some local, green-fingered gardeners who would like to show off their gardens and give some top tips to others. Then you could arrange an open garden day. Charge visitors a fee to pop along and view the garden and gain some gardening advice. Make more funds by selling refreshments.

- **Make and sell seed bombs**

Make your own seed bombs and package them up into little gifts that people can donate towards. This is a good fundraiser but also great for nature.

Fundraising Ideas for Businesses

- **Alumni Networking Luncheon**

Bringing together a group of people for a dinner or luncheon gives you the opportunity to ask for donations. Make it an interesting affair and pull in more people by inviting an interesting speaker to address the group.

- **Charity Auction**

Here's the deal! Get local businesses to make donations for Catalyst Foundation; arrange a lot of goodies, a venue, sell tickets, get refreshments in place, and auction. It may be a lot to do, but when you see the amount of donations that pour in, it is certainly worth it.

- **Eco Fines**

This one you can do at work as well as at home. But make sure that you have supporting people around you before you do this. Every time someone does something that is not eco-friendly (leaving the lights/computer on, leaving the taps running, printing unnecessary emails, using fresh papers for rough drafts) you could give them a small fine, which you can donate at the end of the month.

- **Guess the Baby Photo**

This has been the source of hilarity in workplaces for many years. Willing participants pay an entry fee and bring in a photo of themselves as a baby. Everyone taking part then tries to guess who each baby grew up to be. The person who gets the most correct wins. It's amazing and very funny just how different (or similar) our baby selves were!

- **Matched Giving**

This has brought in a lot of money for different charities. Basically, you fundraise a sum of money through another fundraising idea, and you get a company to agree to match whatever sum you raise. This doubles the amount that you would have ended with. The company will get increased exposure as well as helping a great cause.

- **Payroll Donations**

Fundraising within an organization is an incredible idea if you can pull it off. If you own a company, a store, or any business that involves employees, you can float a program that lets them donate via payroll. As soon as their salaries are credited, the donations will be legally transferred to Catalyst Foundation. The best part is that they do not have to pay taxes on it.

- **Sell your Skills**

The best part of this is that the work involved is varied. Just convince people to stay one extra hour, or to come in early and teach one special skill like cooking, baking, knitting, playing guitar, dancing, or whatever talent you can find at work. Colleagues who wish to learn can pay a nominal fee each week, and that is the amount that goes to Catalyst Foundation.

- **Sponsored Outfit**

You could find yourself getting a few laughs here. The idea is to let people choose what outfit you wear for a day – or any length of time. For this privilege, they will pay a sponsorship fee, which is how you contribute to Catalyst Foundation.

- **Swear Box**

Like eco-fines but with what you say. It's a great fundraising idea as it encourages less swearing and raises money for Catalyst Foundation. Ask for a donation every time someone swears and place it in a publicly viewable box for extra encouragement. Try it at work, or at home, any place where people regularly congregate.

Indoor Fundraising Ideas

- **Denounce a Vice**

It might be alcohol, smoking, junk food, or whatever else you think is bad for you. Convince the people of your community to sponsor you, and the ones who are with you in this, to denounce a vice. You could have one sponsor each day for giving it up for a certain period.

- **Give Away the Best Seat in the House**

When your team's next match comes up, try to get one of the local stores to donate a comfy couch. Now put up a raffle for this, the best seat in the house. This can be a regular fundraising idea each season.

- **Scrip**

It simply means substituting money, and this kind of charity fundraiser works very well for schools, non-profit organizations, and religious causes as well. It usually goes something like this – churches, schools, and other non-profit organisations buy vouchers from certain retailers at a discount. These are then passed on to supporters at a little higher price for buying services or goods from those very retailers. As the charity bought it for a comparatively lesser price than the one it is sold for to the supporters, this can be quite a great source of funds for charities and is almost an offline version of TheGivingMachine!

Outdoor Fundraising Ideas

- **Busking**

Do you play an instrument, sing, or can you entertain? Then this could be for you. You'll need to find a well populated area (and make sure you have a license if needed), make a sign, and start fundraising!

• **Charity Car Wash**

If you like to have a little fun with water, you will certainly find this idea the easiest way to fundraise. Along with many more volunteers like you, choose a community place, a parking lot, or a door-to-door option. Offer to wash cars for a reasonable charge, and you will see people flocking to get it done. Not a very novel idea, but a lucrative one indeed.

• **Christmas Carols**

Sing Christmas carols to raise funds for Catalyst Foundation and spread the Christmas cheer. If it's the right time of year, consider this as a great option to help raise funds for Catalyst Foundation.

• **Lawn Mowing**

If you can do it for your parents, you can do it for Catalyst Foundation too. Just make some fliers to let people know that you can mow their lawn for a tiny charge which goes towards the Foundation. People are likely to pay generously.

• **Obstacle Course Event**

This one is much more interesting than a standard race. It is a race, but at the same time it is much more than that – a real test of talent and timing that is more exciting and rewarding. Also, when looking for engagement from the public, it tends to be the case that the more special the task, the higher the willingness for participation. Tickets for those who wish to see the contest will raise a lot of revenue. A bonus? The refreshments that you can sell during the event.

• **Plant Sale**

Make sure you do it in a season that is ideal for planting, so spring and summer mainly. You will have to plan well ahead to sow a variety of seeds and prepare the saplings in time for sale.

• **Recycle**

Recycling cans is a good idea. Most recycling units pay for the cans; just pick up the ones that are littered around in your area and turn them in for recycling. One more thing, it will help make your surroundings cleaner.

• **Sleep Rough - Sleep Easy**

Have you thought of sleeping rough for one night – so that others don't have to? Building your own cardboard shelters, trying to stay warm and secure will provide a glimpse into the very real hardships and challenges faced by the vulnerable individuals supported by Catalyst Foundation. Are you ready for the challenge – can you find sponsorship and create greater awareness?

• **Sponsored Litter Cleaning**

Even a small gesture like cleaning litter in public places such as local parks is a great fundraising idea to get donations. Gather some like-minded people to volunteer and you are sure to get a sponsor or two as this one makes a visible difference.

• **Taxi Service**

The idea of this is to raise money by friends and family paying you to give them a lift rather than a conventional taxi. Perhaps they are going on a night out or to the airport. Most people will be happy to know they are helping a good cause, whilst also getting something they would have paid for anyway. The downside, you will have to have a car and be able to drive.

Community Fundraising Ideas

• **Bring and Buy Sale**

Well, if you can gather enough sellable items from your attic or from your neighbors, you can do some good fundraising by putting on a sale. You could invite other people to set up a stall at a minimal charge.

• **Movie Night**

Organise a location, get a projector, and have a movie night! Fundraise via entry donations and selling movie snacks; popcorn, sweets and drinks, will go down well too.

• **Coffee Morning**

Coffee is a morning essential for so many people everywhere. Consider tapping into this ritual to raise money for Catalyst Foundation. People are going to be buying it anyway, this way they can put their funds towards something good. You could double up and serve breakfast snacks to bring in some extra money.

• **Getting an Idea Sponsored**

Well, it may be a more difficult choice than raising funds with other methods, but if you have the conviction, it can work out well. The pro is that you can be imaginative. Getting sponsorship for a walkathon, a flash mob, or a silence march, whatever you think best conveys your message can work well. One point to watch out for, you will have to be really good with selling skills so that you can get a sponsor.

• **Jumble Sale**

A jumble sale can be done on any weekend. All you have to do is inform people about the event. On the day of the event, you just need a few tables and a few people who can manage the money. People are usually generous at doing this, so you can turn this fundraising idea into a regular feature.
